

Privacy Policy

Managed Capital Finance takes your privacy seriously. We are committed to protecting the personal information you share with us and to handling it lawfully, fairly and transparently. This Privacy Policy explains what data we collect, how we use it and the steps we take to keep it safe.

We collect business information to provide credit profiling, financial analysis, fraud prevention, and data insights for our clients. The information we hold may include names, contact details, identification documents, company registration details, financial information and analytical results created from that data. We may receive this information directly from you, from your organisation or from trusted sources such as credit reference agencies, financial institutions and public records including Companies House (or Gov.uk)

We only use your information for legitimate business purposes such as providing our services, complying with legal or regulatory obligations, preventing fraud and improving the accuracy of our analytical models. We do not sell personal data and we do not share it unless it is necessary to provide our services or to meet legal requirements. When we share data with partners or suppliers, we ensure that they follow strict privacy, confidentiality and security standards.

Your information is stored securely using encryption, access controls, and network protection systems. We regularly review and test these measures to ensure your data remains safe. All employees, contractors and service providers are trained in data protection and are required to maintain strict confidentiality.

On occasion, your data may be transferred outside the United Kingdom for example, when we use international technology or cloud providers. In such cases, we ensure appropriate legal safeguards are in place such as adequacy decisions or approved contractual clauses to maintain the same level of protection your data receives in the UK.

We do not retain personal data as a standard practise but only if it is required to deliver our services and meet our legal obligations. When the information is no longer needed, it is securely deleted or anonymised.

Your Right to information include the right to access your data, have inaccurate data corrected, request deletion where appropriate, restrict or object to how it is used, and request that it be transferred to another organisation. You may also withdraw your consent to processing at any time where consent has been provided. To exercise any of these rights, please contact us via our contact form on our website however our staff may need to verify your identity before processing your request.

We do not intentionally collect or process personal data relating to individuals. We also do not engage in automated decision making or profiling that produces legal or significant effects without human oversight and safeguards.

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We review this Privacy Policy regularly to ensure it remains accurate and compliant with data protection law. Any updates will be published on our website, and significant changes will be communicated where appropriate.
